## Description

This workshop is part of this process of self-preparation, empowerment and autonomy by giving them the keys to preparing themselves psychologically and materially to leave their homes for an indefinite period. In practical terms, by the end of the workshop, participants should know what items to take with them as a priority in the event of evacuation.

Key features:

- Quick and easy workshop;
- Involve the audience.

### Duration

10 at 30  
minutes

### Resources needed

To use the tool, we need:

- A game board;
- Objects (nappied, toy, scissors, toilet paper, etc.).

### Age

7+ years old

### Relevance to CRISEPAC Objectives

This workshop, created by EPTB Seine Grands Lacs, includes the objectives of the CRISEPAC project because it prepares to a natural disaster.

### Expected outcomes

- Understand the importance of a survival kit;
- How to react during an evacuation;
- What is necessary to carry on in your survival kit;
- Be prepared at any time.

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## Management

The teacher needs to find the materials needed to run the workshop and create any teaching aids that may be required.

No knowledge is required.

## Risk prevention

Preparing to evacuate and choosing the essentials for during and after a disaster.

## Others

### Weaknesses

This activity particularly concerns households affected by large-scale flooding or else, sometimes for a long period.

It is also necessary to have many equipment to show examples of essential and non-essential items.

### Strengths

This activity helps to prepare children for evacuation, which can happen in areas that are heavily affected by natural risks. Some families can evacuate for weeks or even months. It is important to understand what is essential to take in the event of an evacuation. Furthermore, survival kits are required in schools, and every class has one.

### Possible adaptations

Could be adapted to different disasters and different place.

For instance, it's mandatory in French schools.

### Climate change

Natural hazards will be much more intense and more common because of global warming.

The survival kit is one of the preparedness measures that can be used for any risk situation and on any scale.

## Methodologies

The workshop begins with a question from the facilitator: "If you had to evacuate your home because of flooding, what would you take with you?"

Another option is to present a flood situation to immerse the children in the subject (or another disaster).

Unfold the board on a table or on the floor and ask the children to sit around it.

Spread the objects around and ask the children in turn to place the objects on the part of the board that they think corresponds.

Correct with the children, justifying their choices and explaining the purpose of the object.
