Relevance to CRISEPAC Objectives

This tool responds to the objectives of the CRISEPAC project, focusing on prevention and preparedness for floods, fire and storms and also give some advice in other emergency situations.

Expected outcomes

This material helps to understand:

- How to prepare yourself for different emergencies?
- What to do when you get lost in a forest, in an urban area?
- How to inform people about emergencies and how to get the information needed?
- How to protect people and their property?
- How to react in other potentially dangerous situations?





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Management

The teacher and pupils can choose chapters that they want to discover and learn about different topics. This tool shows also that there are a lot of different situations and a lot of different crises which could be managed in daily life. Teachers can also organise group work – each group gets a specific topic and writes down most important things about this topic.

Emergency situations are increasingly connected to climate change, as rising temperatures and extreme weather events lead to more frequent natural disasters, such as floods, wildfires, and hurricanes, which can overwhelm response systems and threaten public safety and infrastructure.
